



by Amy Welborn Magnificat/Ignatius Press | \$14.95 | 32 pages






The Night Before My First Communion

On the night before their First Communion, a brother and sister get ready for this important event. All the family is there—family, grandparents, godparents—to help them prepare for the following day.



by Josephine Nobisso Ginger Bread House | \$11.95 | 32 pages



Luminous old-world watercolor paintings grace the interior of the book and gold foil artwork lends an air of solemnity and sacred beauty to the story.

by Angela M. Burrin Word Among Us Press | \$16.95 | 48 pages








The Mass Explained to Children



by Joan Carroll Cruz TAN Books | \$16.95 | 352 pages



Eucharistic Miracles also recounts miraculous Eucharistic phenomena in the lives of saints: saints who lived with only the Eucharist for sustenance, received Communication miraculously, or experienced raptures, ecstasies, levitations, visions, locutions, and more. Pictures and photographs of the miracles, the churches they took place in, and the people involved are also included, adding the final touch to a comprehensive, detailed, and extraordinary overview of these miraculous happenings.

by Father Mitch Pacwa, SJ. Our Sunday Visitor | \$10.95 | 112 pages



by Joe Heschmeyer Catholic Answers Press | \$18.95 | 174 pages



by Vinny Flynn Mercy Song/Ignatius Press | \$9.95 | 131 pages






30 Marian Eucharistic Visits: Adoring Jesus with His Mother



A Biblical Walk through the Mass by Edward Sri Ascension Press | \$14.99 | 198 pages


